

Alphabet Song Chart

These charts help students relate the names of letters to their upper and lower case shapes.

Use these alphabet charts when children sing the alphabet song.

Each child needs a chart in front of him or her.

The letters are arranged to match the phrasing of the song.

The vowels are in red so that students can start identifying vowels early.

Directions for basic usage:

- Children look at and touch each letter as they sing the names of the letter.
- Be sure students sing slowly enough for l-m-n-o-p so that each is clearly articulated as an individual letter name.

Variations:

1. Fast Fingers

- Have students hold up their index finger.
- You say a letter name.
- The children find and point to that letter very fast.

2. Teach the names of vowel letters.

- Teach the students that the vowels are in red.
- Children still touch each letter as they sing the song, but they whisper all the letter names except vowels, which they sing in a normal voice.

2. Find and Sing

- Students use their Fast Finger to find and point to a letter the teacher (or another student) names.
- After all children have found the letter and are pointing to it, the teacher says sing.
- All children start singing the Alphabet Song while pointing to the letters, starting with the letter that was named.
